GALLERIES

The fair is pleased to present, in 2016, a refreshed selection of 70 galleries, with 18 exciting new participants exhibiting for the first time, including Grey Noise (Dubai); Hafez Gallery (Jeddah); Edel Assanti (London); Sabrina Amrani (Madrid); and Marie-Laure Fleisch (Rome), Todd Hosfelt (San Francisco) alongside returning galleries such as Thomas Erben (New York); Galleria Continua (San Gimignano, Les Moulins, Beijing); Chemould Prescott Road (Mumbai); Experimenter (Kolkata), GALLERYSKY (Bangalore, New Delhi) and Espace (New Delhi).

PLATFORM

In line with India Art fair's renewed focus on the most critical work underway in South Asia, Platform, its new initiative focused on regional art spaces and collectives, presents an array of programmes, including Nepal Art Council, Blueprint12, Theertha Artists Collective, Taseer Art Gallery, and Swaraj Art Archive, that have never before exhibited at an art fair.

INSTITUTIONAL

As part of India Art Fair's expanded programming this year, a number of leading international and Indian museums and foundations will also participate directly at the fair in a new programme Institutional. Presenting elements of their programmes or collaborations specially commissioned for the fair, participating institutions include the Delfina Foundation, Dr. Bhau Daji Lad Museum, Kiran Nadar Museum of Art, and the Korean Cultural Centre India.

PROJECTS

Projects presents 14 select exhibits by individual artists showcasing significant new work. Projects by artists Ram Rahman, Joël Andrianomearisoa, Krishna Reddy, Wim Delvoye, Julien Segard and Sakshi Gupta amongst others, will punctuate the newly conceived space of India Art Fair, designed in collaboration with leading architecture firm Morphogenesis.

SPEAKERS' FORUM

In addition, the fair's acclaimed Speakers' Forum, supported by Forum Partner, Goethe-Institute, addresses access and integration across South Asia and the convergence of disciplines. Key conversations will explore how private collections can be activated for public engagement and draw into discussion leading voices from a new generation of collectors from across South Asia. With a shared purpose to promote cultural discourse in the region and provide a platform for such discussion, Godrej India Culture Lab, Asia Art Archive, Institut français en Inde, British Council and ART India are on board with the fair as academic collaborators of the forum.

SPOTLIGHT

The fair is also pleased to host Spotlight, at India Art Fair's new Atrium. Spotlight provides a more intimate context in which to hone in on discussions with a spectrum of artists, institutions and publications. The Atrium will also play host to the fair's inaugural film programme, Moving Image Art, curated by Shai Heredia, filmmaker and Director of Experimenta. In line with the India Art Fair's new commitment to multidisciplinary programming, the programme will screen cutting edge film and video art from Asia and beyond, with a focus on memory, politics of form, space and time.

BMW AND ART

India Art Fair is proud to partner with BMW as Presenting Partner. As a part of BMW's global cultural engagement, this year's edition of the India Art Fair features the BMW Art Car designed by César Manrique. The BMW Art Car Project was introduced by the French race car driver and auctioneer, Hervé Poulain in 1975, when he invited an artist to create a canvas on an automobile. Since then a total of 17 BMW Art Cars, based on both racing and regular production vehicles, have been created. The model of the BMW 730i Art Car designed by César Manrique in 1990, will be presented at India Art Fair 2016.
