Swaraj Art Archive

Noida, India

Established in 2013, Swaraj is an archive created to document, preserve and showcase the art of Mr. Vijay Kumar Aggarwal's family collection. The building is situated in Noida, harboring a large body of artworks from Bengal, Bombay, and Lucknow Schools along with works by almost every Indian artist from the pre-independence era to the 1980s. Swaraj Art Archive presents 'Artists from Afar: Paintings and Watercolours of India by European Artists 1780-1947', a precedent exhibition to last year's The Company School: Indo-British Painting in Colonial India from the Swaraj Collection.

Commencing around the mid-1700s, mostly amongst the British upper and middle classes and as a part of the officers' training in the British Army and the East India Company, drawing was an integral part of liberal education which resulted in a colossal mass of visual material documenting India's pre-photographic past. Our country provided them with fresh subjects - the unexplored lands, its exotic people, and their curious lifestyles and practices – while they equipped us with a rich and varied record of enormous importance for today's understanding of the history of India during that period.

RATHIN BARMAN One, and the Other (Site 1-4) Supported by: Experimenter

Urban architecture and architectural forms are one of the primal interests of Rathin Barman's recent practice. Documentation of architectural sites in the form of sculptures & drawings unveils many facets of structural evolution to define the idea of contemporary urban landscape.

One, and the Other (Site 1-4) is a series of architectural maquettes of century old buildings from Calcutta, that are about to be demolished. Such a process of transformation introduces a different idea of space, material and structural notions, which have been juxtaposed or emotionalised to mark a series of architecture in situations through sculptural pieces.

ANILA QUAYYUM AGHA ALL THE FLOWERS ARE FOR ME Supported by: Aicon Gallery

Aicon Gallery is pleased to present All The Flowers Are For Me, the first major piece by Anila Quayyum Agha to be shown in India. In 2014, Anila's now iconic sculptural installation Intersections was awarded the Public Vote Grand Prize and split the Juried Grand Prize at the 2014 ArtPrize competition in Grand Rapids, MI. The installation has since traveled internationally and nationally with critical acclaim in exhibitions worldwide.

In the floral beauty of All The Flowers Are For Me patterns and layers, the cuts and embroidery strive to capture the identity, beauty, and femininity of her mother and other mothers that become obscured by gravestone and shroud. These patterns pay homage to the organic to which death is inevitably linked but from which new life also emerges. The material of the work is stainless steel, painted red and cut with delicate patterns that reflect and refract light. The work encompasses the viewer totally and transforms any environment in which the sculpture is shown.

AVINASH VEERARAGHAVAN Dwell in Possibility Supported by: GALLERYSKE

The project consists of 3 laser cut veneer panels and a video in a room that's covered with thousands of images from the artist's visual archive. Placed within this sea of images that represents a tiny mirror to our

vast consciousness, the physically layered laser cut panels describe a personal and mythic narrative. An empty discarded chair in ruins, a circus routine and a cartoon of skeletons dancing function as an open ended phrase of a poem. A video edited with found footage of mechanical principles attempts to hypothesise how the narrative may come to be.

KANU'S GANDHI Photographs by Kanu Gandhi Supported by: PHOTOINK

Kanu Gandhi (1917-1986) was the son of Narandas Gandhi, a nephew of Mahatma Gandhi. Two years after his birth, the family moved to Gandhi's Sabarmati Ashram, where Narandas worked as a manager. In 1934 Gandhi came to Wardha, in Central India, and founded Sevagram, which soon became a bustling ashram. Though Kanu wanted to be a doctor, in 1936 he was persuaded by his father to join Gandhi's personal staff at Sevagram where he came to be known as 'Bapu's Hanuman'. It was during this time Kanu developed an interest in photography and persuaded Gandhi to allow him to photograph him. Gandhi imposed three conditions on Kanu: that he would never use a flash; that he would never ask him to pose; and that the ashram would not fund his photography.

Edited from a long forgotten archive, these painstakingly restored photographs offer an extraordinarily rare and intimate account of the Mahatma's life and his interactions with political leaders of the freedom movement.

CONCEPTUALISED BY RENU MODI A TALE OF TWO CITIES | INDIA & SRI LANKA Programming by Serendipity Arts Trust Gallery Espace in collaboration with Theertha International Artists Collective

This project that was initiated in the year 2015, is a strong step towards addressing the issues of shared histories within the sub-continent. Six artists from India and five from Sri Lanka embarked on a journey to understand the politics of cities, religions and the stories that places tell. Both Anuradhapura and Varanasi in themselves are witness to the past, the present and serve as a trajectory to the future. The intention of this project at the India Art Fair is to engage, question and re-affirm the importance of the process over the end. The story of this engagement is being bought forth through audio-visual media documenting the interactions of the artists with the city and with each other.

JOËL ANDRIANOMEARISOA When the Day Belongs to the Night Supported by: Sabrina Amrani

Sabrina Amrani Gallery is pleased to present *When The Day Belongs to the Night*, a project specifically created for India Art Fair 2017 by Joël Andrianomearisoa. The artist was interested in envisioning a project that speaks to India's complex and multiplicitous landscape of experiences, as well as to his own aesthetic interests in textiles. When the day belongs to the night is a triptych of tapestries, each of which is more than 9 meters in length and 2 meters high, in minimalist designs that only reveal underlying structures and yield a richer conversation when one moves closer to them.

This project is supported by Thibault Poutrel Contemporary Art (TPCA).

REENA SAINI KALLAT Woven Chronicle Supported by: Museum of Modern Art (MOMA)

Treating electric wires as if they were yarn, Kallat created a woven map tracing the routes of contract workers, indentured laborers, asylum seekers, refugees, and other migrants across the planet. The wires act as both conduits and barriers, simultaneously referring to global networks of communication and commerce as well as to barbed wires or fences. The work highlights the inherent contradiction in celebrating an increasingly connected world while stringent immigration laws, closed borders and prejudice face individuals seeking to transgress geographic boundaries. From within the woven web resonates a mixture of high-voltage electric currents, deep-sea ambient noise, slow electric pulses, the hum of engaged phone tones, a mechanical drone, factory sirens, ship horns, and migratory bird calls. These sounds awaken the map, transforming the cartographic work into a dynamic entity.

MITHU SEN Phantom Pain Supported by: Nature Morte

Continuing her explorations into language, poetics, drawing and installation, Mithu Sen will present a new work which straddles defined categories of art-making as well as the distance between the artist and her audience. Sen's practice is auto-biographical and cathartic, she delves into psychological terrain and gives form to her emotions.

PARUL GUPTA AND HEMANT SREEKUMAR Supported by: Exhibit320

Parul Gupta's work is rooted in a performative subjectivity of body, perception and architectural space. For Gupta, drawing reflects a series of concerns prompted by repetitive action both fueled by internal (somatic & psychic) and external (drawing & environment) phenomena simultaneously. Hemant Sreekumar performs synthetic audio compositions using principles of emergence and noise. Artists Parul Gupta and Hemant Sreekumar's collaboration started at 1After320 through its program 'Artist Process' which looks to enable formats through which cultural producers working within and outside of institutional spaces simultaneously, arrive at various possibilities that push their practice forward. Collaborating at various stages through 2016, the iteration at IAF 2017 includes site-specific drawings and interventions by Parul Gupta alongside an executable code and projection by Hemant SK titled PGX – ALPHA that is based on an instruction set by Gupta. Hemant in a sense unfolds the process where the 'growth' manifests as a sequential decay into nothingness and re-emergence.

FRANCIS LIMERAT Untitled Supported by - baudoin lebon

A dark-red column stands erect, cutting into the void. It is made of wood-stick structures one may watch through. A sort of eye-catcher the lines of which draw limits in and out for the viewer to imagine perspectives deep inside or beyond the first-sight embrace.

Its human-sized format invites anyone to wander when following the lines on the surface or making his/her way through the scope of his choice and allows a playful confrontation to anyone passing by.

SUDARSHAN SHETTY Taj Mahal Supported by: Kiran Nadar Museum of Art

One of the most innovative artists working with a radical contemporary sensibility, Sudarshan Shetty is interested in the journey that an object makes across its boundaries. Shetty's sculptural installations with the amalgamation of incongruous objects and mechanised moving parts have an unpredictable element of poetry and shock. The subversion of scale and material radically transform the ready-made an enable new meanings. Sudarshan explores material and medium in order to examine history, memory, and desire.

Taj Mahal is constructed with more than 250 miniature metallic reproductions of the monument, within which there is a video sequence showing the central dome of the actual building, a mausoleum for love, consumed by flames. One of the seven wonders of the world, its aura has been marketed and consumed as tacky metal and stone souvenirs. The multiple copies speaks of its commoditisation, asking us to consider how an icon representing immortal love, is abused and manufactured as mindless reproductions.

VANITA GUPTA

Breathe In, Breathe Out: A Medley in Spatial Registers Supported by: Art Heritage

Vanita Gupta's Breathe In, Breathe Out: A Medley in Spatial Registers explores the relationship between continuity and rupture, gravity and lightness, and the potentially infinite extension of shape and the concrete finitude of mass. Experimenting with contrasting materials that bend and yield, and integrating multiple forms including drawing, video projection and the three dimensionality of a sculpture, Vanita realises an artwork on a life-size scale that offers the observer an interactive and immersive experience.

NO MAN'S LAND

Supported by: Britto Arts Trust & Shelter Promotion Council

'No Man's Land', a community based public art project was held between 22-27 March 2014.

The border and the huge fence between India and Bangladesh not only divide similar ethnic groups of people having similar culture, language and history but interrupt the natural flow of biodiversity as well. It was an attempt to do the project across the border to shape and understand the strong historical, cultural and sociological contexts that govern in Bangladesh and India.

Artists concentrated on the villages of Bholaganj in India and Puran Bholaganj in Bangladesh. They finally made it to meet with each other without passports on 27th March 2014 at the physical space of No Man's Land.

THUKRAL AND TAGRA Memoir Bar Supported by: FICA

Pick a memory and write it down on a piece of paper. Shred it into a fine form and watch it being made into a tile. The act of encapsulating a memory in an object, or solidifying and preserving an emotion forever, forming a library of preserved memories. Using your memory as your currency, you obtain the power to relive it through the object at will. Constructing a large sanctuary of compressed emotion, a memory pavilion.

We would like to view this as a transfer and exchange station to load/drop off and trade with new memories. A station where one deposits emotional currency in to a concrete reserve. Emotional currency is the only medium of exchange relevant to deal in. Keeping transactions as pure and poignant, making you free of surcharge and free from emotional tax.

BROOKHART JONQUIL Ziggurat

Supported by: Floodlight Foundation

Floodlight Foundation is proud to produce and present its artist-in-residence, Brookhart Jonquil's breathtaking light installation (not shown here), especially commissioned for the India Art Fair 2017. Central to his artistic oeuvre is his desire to represent nothingness, to imagine and present the immaterial, through materials like glass, mirror and light; materials which themselves have very little presence, but come into existence based on their interactions with other objects. Brookhart Jonquil (b. 1984) was born in Santa Cruz, California and lives and works in Miami. Brookhart has had several solo and group exhibitions, in Miami, Mexico City, Los Angeles and Tuscon among others and part of the collection of the Museum of Contemporary Art, Tuscon, Fountainhead Collection, Miami, Fundacion Pablo Atchugarry, Uruguay among others.

AKHLAQ AHMED Portrait of an Artist as a Young Man Supported by: Gallery Ragini

This title is taken from James Joyce's novel, Joyce speaks of the political and socio-cultural changes of Ireland about the political climate of England. Dublin is the setting and while speaking of the life of the city he speaks of his own life.

Inspired by this grand narrative Akhlaq Ahmed attempts to capture the nuances of his life which are spread over rural Uttar Pradesh, Mumbai, Delhi and London. He reached Mumbai and started working on hoardings. He painted sign boards for the wayside eateries. He travelled to England to participate in several international exhibitions for street art and graffiti art.

BANI ABIDI Artist

Bani Abidi is a Pakistani contemporary artist. She has held numerous exhibitions and her work is focused on political issues. She uses both photography and videos to construct commentaries and critiques of current politics and culture. Her early engagement with video led to the incorporation of performance and photography into her work. These mediums have provided Abidi with potent, sometimes subversive means to address problems of nationalism—specifically those surrounding the Indo-Pakistani conflict and the violent legacy of the 1947 partition between the two countries.



ASIM WAQIF

Artist

Delhi-based Asim Waqif studied architecture at the School of Planning and Architecture, Delhi and was visiting faculty there from 2005-2011. After initially working as an art-director for film and television he later started making independent video, and documentaries before moving to a dedicated art-practice in 2010.

His recent projects have attempted a crossover between architecture, art and design, with a strong contextual reference to contemporary urban-design and the politics of occupying or intervening or using public spaces.



PORS AND RAO

Artists

Pors and Rao work with objects and installations often incorporating physical animation and responsive behaviours. After toiling with computer simulations, the internet, and gameplay in the early 2000s, they both abandoned the screen to work with objects that engage the body. They crossed paths in Italy in 2002 and started working together in 2004.

Many of their works are conceived as a kind of 'being' with basic behaviors such as shyness, fatigue and dependency, highlighting involuntary aspects of human behaviour and relationships. Some works imply a kind of pre-conceptual way of perceiving the world, where emotions and thoughts are projected onto the things around us — as if everything was conscious.



ABHAY SARDESAI Editor, ART India

Abhay Sardesai has been the Editor of ART India, the premier art magazine of India, since November 2002. Under his editorship, the magazine has developed a culture studies-oriented approach and has become more inter-disciplinary in its theme-based explorations. He has been a visiting faculty in aesthetics at the Department of English, University of Mumbai, and has also been the Chair of Humanities, Kamla Raheja Vidyanidhi Institute of Architecture, Mumbai. He teaches at TISS and the Dr. Bhau Daji Lad Mumbai City Museum. He writes in English and translates from Marathi, Konkani and Gujarati.

As an associate of the research collective PUKAR, he was the director of the Writing Across the City project which explored the inter-relationships between literature and literary cultures in the city of Mumbai.

He has written widely on art and literature and read from his work at various places including the University of Princeton, University of Cambridge, Mumbai University, S.N.D.T. University and NGMA, among others.

ISABELLE AND JEAN-CONRAD LEMAÎTREPrivate Collectors

Prominent video art collectors, the Lemaîtres started collecting moving image in 1996 after coming across a Gillian Wearing video in a London gallery. They view film as a quintessentially contemporary medium which has a great potential for exploration and development. With a focus on collecting works of international contemporary artists who question the world we live in, the work in their collection often questions the limits of our socio-political systems and showcases humanity in transformation. Today the Lemaîtres have developed their collection to include works by artists such as Tacita Dean, Steve McQueen, Atlas Group, Gillian Wearing, Isaac Julien, Omer Fast, Luidgi Beltrame, Mika Rottenberg, Mark Wallinger, Dominique Gonzalez Foerster, and many more.



ANURAG KHANNA

Private Collector

Anurag Khanna has been collecting art for the last 15 years. With a firm belief in no medium being greater than another, his collection consists of diverse artworks from around the world that include videos, paintings, sculptures, photographs, drawings and etchings. With a focus on younger artists, Anurag's collecting practices are largely governed by pieces that have affected him deeply and thus hold more prominence in the collection.



PRATEEK RAJA
Director, Experimenter

Prateek Raja co-founded Experimenter with his wife Priyanka in 2009. The program shows experimental practices by some of the most celebrated artists from all over the world. With an ambitious and challenging multidisciplinary approach, Experimenter mounts interactive installations, multiple channel work, live projects and interventions that question the fraught era we live in. Considered to be at the forefront of contemporary art, Experimenter has pioneered and brought exhibitions of critical international acclaim to Kolkata and India as a whole. Experimenter was awarded 'Best Contemporary Gallery' at Forbes India Art Awards in 2014 & at the India Today Art Awards in 2016. Experimenter's program constantly challenges preexisting norms in the art world, ganering critical acclaim and in doing so has earned them the moniker of being the pacesetter for contemporary practice from the region.

SHEENA WAGSTAFF

Leonard A. Lauder Chairman of Modern and Contemporary Art, The Metropolitan Museum of Art

Sheena Wagstaff leads Modern and Contemporary Art at The Metropolitan Museum of Art. Since autumn 2012, Wagstaff has also initiated and directed The Met Breuer's international exhibition program with a core strand combining ancient and modern art – by taking its cue from The Met's encyclopedic global collections. Along with her team, which includes curators with deep historic and regional expertise, her responsibility is to build and expand the collection culturally and globally. In addition, Wagstaff is working with David Chipperfield Architects on the design process for the new Modern and Contemporary Art wing at The Met.

Prior to The Met, Wagstaff was Chief Curator of Tate Modern and has also held positions at Tate Britain, The Frick Art Museum, Pittsburgh, the Whitechapel Art Gallery, and the Museum of Modern Art, Oxford. Wagstaff has curated more than 20 exhibitions and overseen the curatorial direction of over 50 exhibitions.



MANUEL RABATÉ

Director, Louvre Abu Dhabi

A graduate of the Institut d'Etudes Politiques de Paris and HEC Business School, Manuel Rabaté began his career as Deputy Director of the auditorium of Musée du Louvre where he created new programmes to accompany the creation of the Islamic Arts department. He joined Musée du quai Branly as Deputy Director of cultural development a year before its opening in 2006, where he was responsible for the launch of the museum's first travelling exhibitions. Rabaté was most recently CEO of Agence France-Muséums, the entity established to support the creation of the museum which is born from an inter-governmental agreement between Abu Dhabi and France.



RICHARD ARMSTRONG

Director, Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and Foundation

Richard Armstrong has served as the Director of the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and Foundation since November 2008. Armstrong works with senior staff to maximise all aspects of the foundation's operations: permanent collections, exhibition programs, acquisitions, documentation, scholarship, and conservation. Previously, Armstrong was The Henry J. Heinz II Director of Carnegie Museum of Art, where he also served as Chief Curator and curator of Contemporary Art. From 1981 to 1992, he was a curator at the Whitney Museum of American Art, where he organized four Biennials, as well as several other exhibitions.



SANGITA JINDAL

Chairperson, JSW Foundation

Under Sangita Jindal's leadership, the JSW Foundation has steered a number of initiatives aimed at ameliorating social conditions, heightening environmental consciousness and creating a better India. The Earth Care Awards stand testimony to her commitment to expanding this awareness - in its sixth year this initiative has become a benchmark to judge innovative technological practices in the SAARC region. A spirited connoisseur of art, Jindal also established Kaladham, an arts village in Karnataka that has become an important centre supporting and promoting creative practices.

Jindal has created institutions for vocational training, she promotes the holistic development of the mentally challenged, promotes rural BPOs that create employment opportunities and builds hospitals that counter infant mortality and promote maternal health. An Eisenhower Fellow, Jindal is on the advisory board of several prestigious institutes; The World Monument Fund, Breakthrough, Asa Society India Centre, Archana Trust, TEDx Gateway, amongst others. Recipient of The Woman Philanthropist Award instituted by FICCI, amongst other notable awards, Jindal was also recently invited to chair the UN Women's Empowerment Principles initiative in India.



GAYATRI SINHA

Art Critic, Curator and Director, Critical Collective

Gayatri Sinha is a critic, editor and curator who works in the domains of gender, lens-based art, and cultural politics. She has edited Voices of Change: 20 Indian Artists (Marg 2010), Art and Visual Culture in India 1857- 2007 (Marg Publications, 2009), Indian Art: an Overview (Rupa Books, 2003). As a curator she has worked within museums and institutions in India and abroad including the National Gallery of Modern Art, the National Museum, the Grand Curtius and Musee Ansembourg Belgium, the Newark Museum and Minneapolis Institute of Art, in the USA among others.

Since 2011, she directly supports knowledge in the arts in institutional and non-institutional spaces through her initiative Critical Collective. This is the first such art archive and news magazine on Indian art. Critical Collective has recently collaborated with the Bhau Daji Lad Museum on an 18 month long video program and has engaged with C-MAP MoMA on a research project on Indian art.

MANUEL MATEUS
Principal Architect, Aires Mateus e Associados

Manuel Aires Mateus was born in Lisbon in 1963 and graduated from "Faculdade de Arquitectura / U.T.L" in 1986. He started collaborating with the Arch. Gonçalo Byrne in 1983 and started developing projects with his brother Francisco in 1988. They then independently established Aires Mateus, although it was housed in Gonçalo Byrne's studio in the first years. The increasing scale of work made them establish a larger and autonomous space to fulfil the demands. Since then the scale and the number of projects has been prolific, resulting in several national and international awards. The visibility of their work has lead to them being invited and accepting lecturing and teaching opportunities at several institutions. Among these are the Graduate School of Design in Harvard, The Accademia di Architetura in Mendrízio as well as several others institutions in Portugal. They are currently spread over two studios both based in Lisbon, and have several partnerships with local studios for international works.



ROGER DIENER

Principal Architect, Diener and Diener, Basel, Switzerland

Roger Diener (Basel, 1950) studied at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich (ETHZ) and the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Lausanne (EPFL) with Aldo Rossi and Luigi Snozzi among others. In 1976, he joined the office run by his father, Marcus Diener, which he then took over in 1980.

Following appointments as visiting professor at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Lausanne (EPFL), Harvard University and universities in Vienna, Amsterdam and Copenhagen, he held the position of Professor of Design at the EPFL from 1987 to 1989. From 1999 to 2015 he was a professor at the ETH Zurich where he taught and published at the Studio Basel with Marcel Meili, Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron.

From 2005 to 2013, Roger was a member of the Berlin Monument Authority. He has been an active member of the Federal Commission for Monument Preservation since 2013 and a member of the Baukollegium Berlin since 2014. He has received numerous awards, including the French Grande Médaille d'Or, the Prix Meret Oppenheim and the Heinrich Tessenow Gold Medal.



ALEXANDER SCHWARZ

Partner, David Chipperfield Architects, Berlin

Alexander Schwarz studied architecture at the Eidgenössische Technische Hochschule Zurich, the Staatliche Akademie der Bildenden Künste Stuttgart and the Universität Stuttgart, after completing an education in violin making. He has worked for David Chipperfield Architects since 1996, initially in London and since 1998 in Berlin. In 2006 Alexander became a Managing Director and in 2011 a Partner in the Berlin office. Vir Kotak is an entrepreneur and photographer based out of New Delhi. He has successfully established the multimodal inland logistics, international contract logistics and project management divisions of the J. M. SUNITHA KUMAR EMMART Founder, GallerySKE

Sunitha Kumar Emmart is the founder of GALLERYSKE in Bangalore, which opened in 2003. She has shown consistent commitment to a diverse spectrum of practices in the gallery's programming, which includes work by mid-career artists such as Sheela Gowda, Sudarshan Shetty, Bharti Kher and Prabhavati Meppayll, along with younger artists including Astha Butail, Navin Thomas and Srinivasa Prasad. In 2013, the gallery opened a second space in New Delhi.

GALLERYSKE also hosts residency and outreach programmes, artist talks, book launches and special events to facilitate access and dialogue across the community.



SHIREEN GANDHY

Director, Chemould Prescott Road

Gallery Chemould founded in 1963 by late Kekoo and Khorshed Gandhy, is one of the oldest established commercial art galleries in India. Shireen Gandhy joined the gallery in 1988 and added a new dynamism to its programme by spearheading a particular focus on young emerging artists with an experimental and interdisciplinary approach to practice and media.

In 2007, when they moved into a new space, the gallery was renamed Chemould Prescott Road. Now in it's 53rd year, the gallery remains relevant with a robust contemporary programme. While the gallery artists include those who address materiality and tradition, the programme constitutes a range of India's mid-career artists, many of whose practices remain to be socially and politically relevant in the international arena of contemporary art.



PRIYANKA RAJA

Director, Experimenter

Priyanka Raja co-founded Experimenter with her husband Prateek Raja in 2009. The program shows experimental practices by some of the most celebrated artists from all over the world. With an ambitious and challenging multidisciplinary approach, Experimenter mounts interactive installations, multiple channel work, live projects and interventions that question the fraught era we live in. Considered to be at the forefront of contemporary art, Experimenter has brought and pioneered exhibitions of

critical international acclaim to Kolkata and India as a whole. Experimenter was awarded 'Best Contemporary Gallery' at Forbes India Art Awards in 2014 & at the India Today Art Awards in 2016. Experimenter's program constantly challenges pre-existing norms in the art world garnering critical acclaim and is looked upon as a pacesetter for contemporary practice from the region.



RENU MODIFounder, Gallery Espace

Renu Modi founded Gallery Espace in New Delhi in 1989 with an exhibition of autobiographical works of M. F. Husain, modern India's most celebrated artist and one of the founding members of the groundbreaking Progressive Artists Group. They soon became synonymous with representing artists whose works defined the 1980s, such as Jagdish Swaminathan, Manjit Bawa, Krishen Khanna, Bhupen Khakhar, Zarina Hashmi, Krishna Reddy and Vishwanadhan. Espace has constantly traversed borders and boundaries, showcasing the art of primarily Indian artists from multiple generations in diverse mediums.



HENA KAPADIA

Founder and Director, TARQ Gallery

Hena Kapadia is founder and gallery director of TARQ, a contemporary art gallery in Mumbai. After majoring in Art History and Economics at Tufts University in Massachusetts, she completed her Masters Degree in Modern and Contemporary Art World Practice at Christie's Education, University of Glasgow in London.

At TARQ, she is focused on exhibiting and engaging with art that is both process driven and thought provoking. A key interest of her practice is to maintain close relationships with both artists and patrons, and to encourage thoughtful acquisitions of art. Apart from TARQ's regular shows, the gallery is also committed to building an educational structure that enables the art community to grow through discussion, debate and dialoque across a spectrum of fields.

LEKHA PODDAR Co-founder, Devi Art Foundation

Lekha Poddar is a philanthropist, business woman, and an art collector, who has been a patron for modern, contemporary, textile and folk art since the 1980s. Her passion for supporting the arts led to the formation of Devi Art Foundation in 2008. She has been the Co-chair of the South Asian Acquisition Committee at Tate Modern, London since October 2012 and a member of the Tate International Council since October 2013, and in 2008 was also on the Asian Advisory Board of the Guggenheim Museum, New York. Her philanthropic efforts have also extended to architectural restoration projects such as those undertaken at the Neemrana Fort Palace Hotel in Alwar District, Rajasthan, and Devi Garh, an 18th century Fort Palace near Udaipur, Rajasthan.

Anubhav Nath is the Director of Ojas Art, an arts initiative and Co-founder of the Ramchander Nath Foundation (RNF). 




'Art on Film' is an exploration of the intersection between film-making and the visual arts in India from the 1960s to the present day. The programme consists of films about artists and those made by artists, and sees filmmakers and artists work across genres to push the boundaries of their respective mediums. The films span several decades of image-making and follow the narrative of Indian art from Modernist abstraction to the Narrative Figuration. The programme has been co-curated by filmmaker Avijit Mukul Kishore and architect and academic Rohan Shivkumar, with the Godrej India Culture Lab.

(OPENING FILM) EVENTS IN A CLOUD CHAMBER

Directed by Ashim Ahluwalia Colour, 16mm and Super8 on video, 21 min, 2016 Courtesy: Future East and Jhaveri Contemporary

In 1969 Akbar Padamsee, one of the pioneers of Modern Indian painting, made a visionary 16mm film called Events In A Cloud Chamber. This was one of the only Indian experimental films ever made. The print is now lost and no copies exist. Over 40 years later, filmmaker Ashim Ahluwalia worked with Padamsee, now 89 years old, to remake the film.

KOODAL

Directed by Tyeb Mehta B/W, 35mm on video, 17 min, 1970

Produced by Films Division

Tyeb Mehta's only short film was a radical 17-minute documentary from 1970. This experimental work examined the Tamil concept of 'Koodal', meaning union or meeting point, via the assemblage of black and white images of Mumbai (then Bombay). This is a film with neither dialogue nor narration. Instead, Mehta's imagery operates within a specially-composed soundscape of drumming, chants and sitar to produce an audio-visual experience that is both surreal and hypnotic.

THROUGH THE EYES OF A PAINTER

Directed by M. F. Hussain B/W, 35mm on video, 18 min, 1967

Produced by Films Division

M. F. Husain made an experimental film for Films Division in the 20th year of India's independence. He visited Rajasthan and sought abstraction in the landscapes, faces and architecture that he filmed. His recurring motifs were a lantern, an umbrella, a cow and a shoe that appear in unexpected places, all united by Pandit Vijay Raghav Rao's experimental sound design. In the midst of all this he paints his iconic images of the Indian peasant - a man and a woman on the facades of houses.

LAL BHI UDHAAS HO SAKTA HAI (EVEN RED CAN BE SAD)

Directed by Amit Dutta Colour, Digital Video, Hindi with English subtitles, 58 min, 2015 Produced by Films Division and Art1st Foundation

This film explores the life and work of writer and painter Ram Kumar. Structured around his stories and paintings, it seeks to etch out the synthesis of word and image in his creations, weaving in fragments of his past and present. The text used in the film is taken from short stories written by Ram Kumar.

WATERMELON, FISH AND HALF GHOST

Directed by Payal Kapadia Colour, Digital Video, Gujarati with English subtitles, 11 min, 2013 Produced by Film and Television Institute of India

This short film is a fable based on a story written by Bhupen Khakhar, the celebrated painter. Khakhar's narrative is a folk-tale of life in a chawl of old Bombay, and delves into the relationships, superstitions and crises that bind its inhabitants. Their life cycles and the concept of infinite time are explored through a mythology of family and lost love.

TO LET THE WORLD IN, VOLUME 1

Directed by Avijit Mukul Kishore Colour, Digital Video, 93 min, 2012 Produced by Art Chennai

To Let The World In, Volume 1 is the first part of a two-volume film project that looks at a significant period in the history of contemporary Indian art from the early 1980s to the present day, featuring the work of three generations of visual artists.

The first volume of the film chronicles the spirit and legacy of a movement that marked the return to narrativity and figuration in Indian art. The exhibition titled "Place for People", which was held in Delhi and Bombay

(now Mumbai) in 1981, brought together a group of artists and a critic who sought to explore locality, class and politics in their practice. Among the inheritors of the legacy of this movement were younger artists who continued this dialogue and also became the interlocutors for the work started by the earlier generation.

The artists featured in this volume are Arpita Singh, Gulammohammed Sheikh, Vivan Sundaram, Nilima Sheikh, Nalini Malani, Sudhir Patwardhan, Ranbir Kaleka, Pushpamala N., Anita Dube and Atul Dodiya along with art critic and curator Geeta Kapur. Their conversations see frequent visitations by the enduring spirit of Bhupen Khakhar, their friend and coartist.

THE COLOUR BLUE: ARE YOU THERE KRISHNA?

Directed by Ein Lall Colour, Digital Video, 30 min, 1998 Produced by Public Service Broadcasting Trust

Arpita Singh describes her growth as a painter in terms of a journey that was taken one step at a time: at every step she needed to consolidate her position before taking another. In her words, "Like you are standing on very known ground, and you know that your one step is placed very firmly on the ground that you know, and then you can take the next step to a place about which you are completely unaware. This unknown space is envisaged as '...a space full of danger, where there is total destruction, total hopelessness. The only thing you are sure of is your faith in yourself - that you really wanted to make this journey'".

The Colour Blue: Are You There Krishna? takes us through her works that span 25 years – from 1971 through to 1996.


